Our Grant Programs 2021-2022

This year we distributed \$1,463,000 in grants.

Lifetime grants total \$17,079,697.

WE ALLOCATED GRANTS THROUGH 3 COMMITTEES:

MAIN GRANTS COMMITTEE – 57 Members distributed \$1,186,000 in grants to 38 Agencies. We fund general operating expenses for Agencies who meet our mission. Agencies are screened to ensure they meet our mission, are a 501(c)(3) and have audited financials. Then they're permitted to apply to our annual cycle which starts in October and ends in March. Each Agency and Program is thoroughly analyzed, and all are visited either in person or via Zoom.

MARLYNN SCULLY STRATEGIC GRANTS COMMITTEE – 13 Senior Team Members approved \$222,000 in grants, of which \$172,000 was distributed to 6 Agencies. The Strategic Committee funds start-ups, off cycle requests, collaboratives, and multi-agency collaborations. We assess requests year-round. Generally, funding is one time.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE – \$55,000 in Scholarships Funds were awarded to JI employees and their children for certificate programs, as well as undergraduate and graduate scholarships.

Grants Awarded

ADULT SENIOR CARE

ALZHEIMER & PARKINSON ASSOCIATION
\$45,000 (2022) | \$452,225 (TOTAL since 2007)



Serves community residents with disorders affecting memory and movement. Our grant funds the *Caring for the Caregiver* program which offers caregivers temporary

relief of up to six hours a day, allowing them to leave loved ones in the care of professional staff while they do errands or replenish themselves with much needed down time.



SENIOR COLLABORATIVE OF IRC
\$20,000 (2022) | \$62,500 (TOTAL since 2018, includes a \$10,000 Strategic Grant)

The program navigates seniors to providers and services through a website and interactive database, together with staff for telephone inquiries. The information and services include both for-profit and not-for-profit resources that a Senior might

need. The project aims to be self-sustaining in the future through the sale of memberships to organizations that serve Seniors.



SENIOR RESOURCE ASSOCIATION AND PUBLIC GUARDIANS
\$55,000 (2022) | \$468,000 (TOTAL since 2004)

We support the *Day Away* centers, located in Vero Beach and Sebastian, which provide coordinated health, social and therapeutic activities in a supervised group setting. The program serves adults who can no longer be left alone during the day due to functional and/or cognitive impairments. Our grant also supports *Public Guardianship* for people of low income deemed legally incompetent and without family or friends willing or able to assume the role of guardian. The program alleviates human suffering, reduces long hospital stays and assures effective use of community resources.



COMMUNITY WELLNESS

LIFEBUILDERS OF THE TREASURE COAST
\$35,000 (2022) | \$265,000 (TOTAL since 2013, includes a \$10,000 Strategic Grant)

Low-income individuals and families affected by the court system have financial needs that cannot be met by public funding. *LifeBuilders* fills that gap and helps these individuals move toward job, family and financial stability by providing small grants to be used for housing, utilities and food/clothing assistance, among other services. *LifeBuilders* works with the Public Defender's Office, Sheriff's Office and social services agencies in Indian River County.



LITERACY SERVICES
\$25,000 (2022) | \$198,500 (TOTAL since 2006)

The mission is to deliver comprehensive and innovative learning opportunities to adults seeking language and literacy skills needed to become more productive citizens. Our grant supports one-to-one volunteer training and the purchase of educational materials.

CRISIS/ FOSTER CARE

CHILDREN'S HOME SOCIETY

\$20,000 (2022) | \$276,500 (TOTAL since 2000)

We fund the **Transitional Living** program for young adults ages 18-22 who have aged out of the foster care system and would otherwise be homeless. At any one time, 8-12 individuals are housed and provided a range of supports while they complete high school and prepare for successful independent living.

HIBISCUS CHILDREN'S CENTER

\$25,000 (2022) | \$235,000 (TOTAL since 2004)

Our grant helps fund the **Career Pathways to Independence** program provided to foster youth ages 13-17 at the Hibiscus Children's Village. The program promotes academic success through the **Pathways** program, leading to high school completion, independent living, college, trades or other employment.



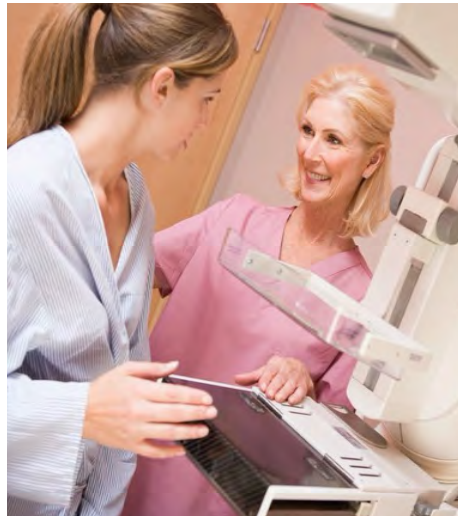
SAFE FAMILIES FOR CHILDREN

\$20,000 (2022) | \$60,000 (TOTAL since 2020)

A community of devoted volunteers create family-like support to keep children safe and families intact and out of the foster care system. During times of family crisis, children are hosted on a short-term basis through Host Families, Family Friends, Family Coaches and Resource Friends, providing a



network for families while they get back on their feet. Safe Families served 138 children last year.



TREASURE COAST COMMUNITY HEALTH

\$40,000 (2022) | \$270,000 (TOTAL since 2013)

Our grant supports their **Woman's Health Fund**, which provides mammograms and other preventive screening to those who cannot afford it. The grant supported 280 women with 368 procedures through October 2021.

HOMELESS/ HOUSING

HOPE FOR FAMILIES CENTER

\$30,000 (2022) | \$538,000 (TOTAL since 2002)

The Center can house up to 21 homeless families with children under 18. Case managers help parents complete a financial literacy course, find employment, develop a budget, save money, move into permanent housing, and enroll children in school,



day-care, or after school programs. The grant supports the **Children's Enrichment** program which takes place in the recently renovated Reading Room. Services include counseling & tutoring. The Program ensures that children are enrolled in school (50% of children are not enrolled in school when they arrive at the Center), daycare, afterschool programs and camps, and provides related transportation.

SAFE SPACE

\$50,000 (2022) | \$361,040 (TOTAL since 2000)

SafeSpace Shelter Advocacy center offers victims of domestic violence safety, support, and education, empowering the survivor to create a safe, independent life, free from violence. SafeSpace was established in 1979 to serve victims of intimate partner violence. Since that time, SafeSpace has grown to become the only State certified domestic violence center on the Treasure Coast. The newly renovated shelter in Vero Beach opened in Spring 2022.



SAMARITAN CENTER

\$32,000 (2022) | \$320,000 (TOTAL since 2009)

The Samaritan Center is a transitional residential facility for homeless families, with programs focused on life skills development (parenting, budgeting and education). The Center provides services through a structured four-tiered program to develop and improve life skills, including responsible parenting, conflict resolution, money management, and education. The Center provides transportation, acts as a liaison with other agencies, provides

parenting classes and educational workshops, counseling, case management, and after care services for up to eighteen months. Adequate completion of all four levels maximizes the success rate of independent living in the community.

TREASURE COAST HOMELESS SERVICES COUNCIL
\$30,000 (2022) | \$559,000 (TOTAL since 2003, includes a \$25,000 Strategic Grant to Every Dream Has a Price)

Our grant funds *Naomi's House*, a temporary housing program for single women in need of housing and younger women who have aged out of foster care, who require housing for 3-6 months. With the help of intense counseling and coaching, the women gain the requisite skills to obtain employment and permanent housing.

COUNSELING/ MENTAL HEALTH

MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION
\$25,000 (2022) | \$458,000 (TOTAL since 2000)

Mental Health Association provides mental health care for children, teens, and their families to address their needs, with a holistic approach including mental health, social, educational and skill building. Their youth *Walk-In & Counseling Center* provides same-day walk-in assistance with immediate access to help.



MENTAL HEALTH COLLABORATIVE: MCCABE CONNECTIONS CENTER
\$30,000 (2022) | \$96,000 (TOTAL since 2017, includes \$66,000 of Strategic Grants)
The *McCabe Connections Center* is a mental health referral service. The center supports children, adults and seniors with underlying mental health and/or substance use disorders who are experiencing quality of life issues and are having difficulty navigating appropriate services in the community. The Center has served 5,400 residents since it opened in 2016.



SUBSTANCE AWARENESS COUNCIL
\$35,000 (2022) | \$480,500 (TOTAL since 2000)
Our grant supports the *Redirect Counseling* program, a prevention program for children ages 12-18 identified with risky behaviors that could lead to substance abuse. This program motivates adolescents and families to aspire to a substance-free and positive lifestyle.

SUNCOAST MENTAL HEALTH CENTER
\$20,000 (2022) | \$196,747 (TOTAL since 2007)
Suncoast provides behavioral and/or mental health services to children, adolescents and adults in IRC who have no health insurance or are underinsured. The Center is dedicated to community-based and family-centered care to ensure positive mental health outcomes for every child and adult.

TYKES & TEENS
\$30,000 (2022) | \$144,000 (TOTAL since 2018, includes a \$24,000 Strategic Grant)

Our grant helps support the *Alternative to Out of School Suspension program (ALTOSS)* for middle and high school students who have been suspended. The program helps students keep up with their schoolwork while suspended, and stresses the importance of positive character, relationships, respect and cooperation. 70% of students who attend the program do not get resuspended.



WHOLE FAMILY HEALTH
\$50,000 (2022) | \$70,000 (TOTAL since 2015)

The *Behavioral Health* program provides therapy and psychiatric services to adults and children in IRC. They also provide sophisticated psychiatric services for treatment-resistant disorders that are not provided elsewhere. Every patient is treated regardless of insurance or ability to pay. The grant will be used to hire an additional licensed therapist.



SPECIAL NEEDS

BALLET VERO BEACH

\$15,000 (2022) | \$15,000 (TOTAL since 2022)



New to the Grants Program this year is Ballet Vero Beach, for their *Education and Engagement* program, which seeks to teach reading through the art of dance in order to address the serious literacy issues

in our area. BVB partners with the IRC school district, The Learning Alliance and IR State College to develop and execute their reading programs, which connect with children through dance and reading stories about the ballet performances.



SPECIAL EQUESTRIANS

\$20,000 (2022) | \$85,325 (TOTAL since 2017)



Our grant supports the *Therapeutic Horseback Riding* program that provides horsemanship instruction to children with disabilities, while using the movement of the horses to achieve physical, cognitive, behavioral, social, and

psychological benefits. The children have various conditions including cerebral palsy, stroke, down syndrome, spina bifida, learning disabilities, developmental delays, and autism. The JICSL grant is used for feed, hay, and shavings for 8 therapy horses, whose care and maintenance are the largest expense of the agency.

SUNSHINE REHABILITATION CENTER

\$15,000 (2022) | \$70,000 (TOTAL since 2018)

We fund the *Sunshine Kids Support Fund* that covers the cost of out-patient rehabilitation therapy to under-insured children with delayed milestones. Early intervention and aggressive therapy ensure the best possible long-term outcomes.



THE ARC OF INDIAN RIVER COUNTY

\$40,000 (2022) | \$501,300 (TOTAL since 2000)

The Arc helps adults with special needs acquire skills that lead to greater independence, more opportunities to make choices affecting their lives, and to become valued members in the communities where they live. Our grant supports the *Training Program* for all new employees who join the organization and continuing education for existing employees. The program is a hybrid of state-mandated training and best practice training designed to prioritize the health, safety, and well-being of the individuals served while maintaining the health and safety of the staff.



NURTURING CHILDREN/EARLY EDUCATION



CHILDCARE RESOURCES

\$35,000 (2022) | \$356,604 (TOTAL since 2000)

Subsidized High Quality Childcare is the primary program focus for Childcare Resources. This Agency strives to ensure young children, from low-income families, access to high quality early learning experiences. The children are age 6 weeks to 5 years. This program prepares them to enter school ready to learn.



EDUCATION FOUNDATION OF IRC

\$35,000 (2022) | \$456,500 (TOTAL since 2000, includes Strategic Grants of \$35,000 + \$13.500)

Our funds support the *STEP into Kindergarten* program, a 6-week pre-kindergarten extension for 225 struggling Pre-K completers. Taught by trained teachers in School District classrooms, the goal of the program is to reduce “summer slide” and to improve school readiness. JICSL funds enabled the start-up of this program in 2013.

JICSL Grants Awarded

E.O.C. HEAD START

\$35,000 (2022) | \$281,000 (TOTAL since 2004)



Our grant funds an **Early Bird (EB)** program at St. Helen's Head Start Center in Gifford. EB is a free, high-quality early childhood care and education program for

at-risk, low-income children ages 2-3 focusing on child and family development/success. It joins two other JI launched EB's in South Vero and at Dодgertown Elementary.

HEALTHY START COALITION

\$75,000 (2022) | \$548,000 (TOTAL since 2000, includes \$60,000 in Strategic Grants)

Healthy Start provides a variety of programs to optimize the health of mothers, children, and families. JICSL currently supports three programs at Healthy Start: **Parents as Teachers (PAT)**, which promotes literacy and school readiness for children 0-3, the **Doula Program**, serving high-risk mothers before, during, and after delivery, and **Nurse Family Partnership**, which helps vulnerable mothers achieve a healthy pregnancy by providing preventative health practices through early prenatal care until the baby's second birthday.



REDLANDS CHRISTIAN MIGRANT ASSOCIATION (RCMA)

\$36,000 (2022) | \$183,000 (TOTAL since 2016)

RCMA operates three childcare centers in low-income areas of IRC serving children from birth to age five. This year's grant will support **The Family Support Worker** at Whispering Pines Child Development Center. The FSW assists families in understanding the challenges they face and in finding assistance. The program helps parents become their child's first teacher and strongest advocate.

EDUCATION AFTER SCHOOL

BOYS & GIRLS CLUB

\$10,000 (2022) | \$262,000 (TOTAL since 2001)

Boys & Girls Club of IRC operates three independent clubs that provide after school programs for children 6-18 years of age in Vero Beach, Fellsmere and Sebastian. Our grant supports the **Power Hour** Program which is designed to focus on six core areas: Education/Career Development, Character/Leadership skills, Sports/Fitness/Recreation, Arts and Community Service.

CROSSOVER MISSION

\$25,000 (2022) | \$201,000 (TOTAL since 2016, includes a \$28,000 Strategic Grant)

We support Crossover's efforts to re-direct "at risk" youth using the love of basketball to motivate athletic and scholastic achievement. Dedicated coaches and volunteer academic mentors help boys and girls become productive adults through a program of year-round basketball training and one-to-one academic mentoring.

GIFFORD YOUTH ACHIEVEMENT CENTER

\$30,000 (2022) | \$590,500 (TOTAL since 2000)

Our grant supports GYAC's **After School Education** program for grades K-12, with certified teachers during the school year providing daily homework

assistance, tutoring, educational/cultural enrichment, socialization, and recreation.



GIFFORD YOUTH ORCHESTRA

\$20,000 (2022) | \$111,500 (TOTAL since 2008)

The Gifford Youth Orchestra **Staging for Success** program is a prevention/enrichment program which believes that by focusing on music education and performance, it will keep the disadvantaged children of Gifford off the streets. Their motto is "Off the Street and On the Stage."



MISS B'S LEARNING BEES

\$20,000 (2022) | \$41,000 (TOTAL since 2021, includes a \$6,000 Strategic Grant)

Project Community Outreach Academic Enrichment Program provides accessibility to a structured after-school program that creates educational opportunities for children to become proficient in math and reading. Additional services include behavioral services for families, a food program that offers participants a healthy snack and nutritious meal each day, and transportation services for families to and from academic enrichment.



A Parent Engagement program also develops relationships between parents, teachers, and the after-school program.

WILLIS SPORTS BASEBALL ACADEMY
\$18,000 (2022) | \$38,000 (TOTAL since 2020)

Willis Sports serves underrepresented and disadvantaged children and youth ages 2-18. The after school and summer programs fuse academics (taught by accredited teachers) with baseball and take place at historic Dodgertown, as well as several nearby elementary schools. We fund **Fun at Bat** (supported by Major League Baseball), for elementary school kids.



EDUCATION — OTHER

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS
\$25,000 (2022) | \$288,500 (TOTAL since 2004, includes a \$18,500 Strategic Grant)

Our grant supports **School and Site-based Reading Mentoring** Program to 4-year-olds in Pre-K centers and low performing K-3rd grade students. Screened and trained volunteers mentor children one-on-one during school hours.



THE LEARNING ALLIANCE
\$75,000 (2022) | \$531,685 (TOTAL since 2011, includes a \$15,575 Strategic Grant)

We fund the **Moonshot Academy** after school program on 6 elementary school campuses. The program serves 387 rising first through third grade students, falling below the 50th percentile of readers based on iReady scores. The mission is to have 90% of their students read on grade level by the end of third grade. Kindergarten Readiness, a program within TLA, supports community-based **Family Connections Centers**, making referrals for Pre-K children to 15 partner agencies.



PELICAN ISLAND AUDUBON INSTITUTE
\$15,000 (2022) | \$50,000 (TOTAL since 2020)

The **Audubon Advocates after school lagoon science program** teaches economically disadvantaged 5th graders to use scientific methods to record results in journals, inspiring them to love and respect our natural surroundings. This natural sciences program exposes the students to Audubon's mission: To preserve and protect animals, birds, plants, and our land and water for future generations.



YOUTH GUIDANCE MENTORING & ACTIVITIES PROGRAM
\$25,000 (2022) - \$216,000 (TOTAL since 2008)

Youth Guidance Mentoring Academy strives to help low income-children in our community break the cycle of poverty through proven one-on-one and group mentoring programs. The focus is on vocational training, social skills development, academic enrichment, and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and math).



Marlynn Scully Strategic Grants Awarded

2021-2022

The Marlynn Scully Strategic Fund, started 6 years ago when Marlynn and Bill Scully gave us \$500,000 in seed funding, has been a game changer for both the JICSL and for Indian River County. It complements our annual grant cycle by allowing us to make off-cycle and multi-year grants, to scale existing high-quality organizations, to provide seed funding for start-up programs, and to help our best agencies try new ventures. Since the Fund was launched in 2017, we have made over \$650,000 in Strategic Grants. We replenish the Fund each year, which enables us to continue to support innovative new ideas and programs that will help IRC.

Many important programs were started with Strategic Funds. We granted Healthy Start the funds to start a Doula program in IRC. This year, because of the exceptional outcomes, the State of Florida has purchased the curriculum to expand Doula to the entire state and the Step into Kindergarten program, which is offered to 5-year-olds the summer before they start Kindergarten, is in its 5th year and serves 225 underserved students. Once started, many of these programs move to our main funding pool so we can help sustain quality initiatives through the regular grant cycle.

2022 NEW COMMITMENTS

United Against Poverty - \$50,000 for a new education program at United Against Poverty called the *UPskill Academy*, which will offer vocational skills training and certifications to IRC adults who are unemployed, underemployed or simply looking to make a career shift. The program works with community and business partners, who work with the students to increase their marketability and candidacy for new career opportunities.

Supportive Legal Services - \$65,000 to fund the research and establishment of quality pro bono and “low bono” legal services in IRC. The first \$15,000 is for the research to determine feasibility of the program, primary areas of unmet legal needs, and collaboration partners throughout the community. If the program is ultimately approved, we will fund an additional \$50,000, along with other funders, to help establish the program.

STEAM Math PLC Project - \$13,500 to help fund a program focusing on middle school algebra teachers and students in SDIRC. The program trains teachers to teach the new Algebra curriculum, and is critical to improving math instruction in the County.

Miss B's Learning Bees - \$6,000 for first Audit of Miss B's, a new after school tutoring program providing access to academic support and behavioral services designed to help students reach and maintain proficiency.

2022 PAYMENTS

on Prior Multiyear Commitments

Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) - \$50,000 for the second year of a 3-year grant for the creation of a program for teens 13-17 at Cleveland Clinic. It provides 12 weeks of after-school therapy, 5 days a week. This was a best practices intervention new to IRC and now has a capacity of 100 patients a year. We have committed an additional \$50,000 for next year as well.

COVID Legal Housing Assistance - \$37,500 final payment for the HEART program to provide pro bono assistance for people with evictions and foreclosures during the pandemic. The success of this program sparked the idea for a new grant this year to establish a broader array of quality pro bono legal service.

The JICSL is extremely proud of the accomplishments of all of our scholarship recipients. Since 1999, we have been awarding scholarships for post-secondary school education to the children of our club's employees. This program was orchestrated in conjunction with Indian River State College. Three years ago, we began to offer scholarships to the club's employees as well. We required that they be tenured, GPA eligible and full time to qualify. Their number has significantly grown since the program's inception. This past year's total was 23 – 11 employees and 12 children. The employees are pursuing everything from Digital Media Technology certificates to 2-year Associate Degrees in Biology, Business Administration, the Culinary Arts and Landscaping, to name a few.

Some of the children are also enrolled at IRSC. Their fields of study include Psychology and Criminology, Business Administration, Occupational Therapy and Nursing. A few of them are now seeking advanced degrees beyond their Bachelors!
